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Discover INVOCELL

An innovative option used in fertility treatment that considers your concerns about cost.

INVOCELL was designed to offer you another option and hope on your fertility journey. INVOCELL is an intravaginal culture (IVC) system and consists of the INVOCELL culture and retention devices. The first and only FDA-cleared device of its kind used in fertility treatment, INVOCELL uses your body as an incubator for fertilization, making you an even greater part of the process.

INDICATIONS FOR USE

INVOCELL® Intravaginal Culture System contains the INVOCELL Culture Device and INVOCELL Retention Device. The Culture Device is indicated for use in preparing, holding, and transferring human gametes or embryos during In Vitro Fertilization/Intravaginal Culture (IVF/IVC) and Intra-cytoplasmic Sperm Injection Fertilization/Intravaginal Culture (ICSI/IVC). The Retention Device is used during the incubation period to aid in holding the Culture Device in the vagina. The Culture and Retention Devices are not indicated for periods of use exceeding 72 hours.

SELECT IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

 Do not use the Culture or Retention devices if you are unable to tolerate having a device placed within your vagina.

In a clinical trial, about 1 in 4 embryo transfers resulted in a birth

INVOCELL was studied in a clinical trial involving 450 cycles, 421 of which resulted in embryo transfers. Of these transfers, **about**1 in 4 resulted in a birth.

It's important to know: adverse pregnancy events, like miscarriage and pre-term births, were reported in the clinical study as these were primarily related to the effectiveness of the device (live birth rate).



An innovative option that considers your concerns about treatment costs

The use of mild ovarian stimulation and fewer monitoring visits, as decided by your doctor, could reduce some of the costs of treatment with INVOCELL. Talk to your doctor about what is best for you.



Unique method that uses your own body as an incubator

Your doctor will place the eggs and sperm in the INVOCELL device, and then position the device in your vagina. Your body provides the environment needed for fertilization and incubation to occur.



Used with mild ovarian stimulation

Before INVOCELL is placed in your body, your doctor will prescribe medicine to help your body produce eggs. He or she will then retrieve the eggs from your ovaries and place them in the INVOCELL culture device with sperm, to let them fertilize and incubate in your body.



You may require fewer monitoring visits, as decided by your doctor

With INVOCELL, you may need fewer monitoring visits. Your doctor will work with you to find out the right number of follow-up visits for your needs.



INVOCELL, IVC, & You

An easy way to think about it is that INVOCELL is the device used in the IVC procedure. During IVC, your doctor will place eggs with sperm in the INVOCELL culture device. Then, he or she will position the device in your vagina for fertilization and incubation to occur.

A CLOSER LOOK AT INVOCELL

INVOCELL has two parts: the culture device and the retention device.



SELECT IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

- Do not use the Culture Device if you are sensitive to medical grade silicone or polystyrene or if you have a severe case of vaginitis or a history of toxic shock syndrome. Tell your doctor if you have had any recent pelvic surgery.
- Avoid any activity such as sexual intercourse, strenuous physical activity, swimming, bathing in a tub (a shower is permissible), use of a douche, sauna, or any other activity that may alter the temperature of the vaginal cavity and avoid handling or removing the Culture and Retention Devices while in place.

HOW IVC WORKS WITH INVOCELL

First, your doctor will prescribe medicine so that your body can produce eggs. Then, your doctor will retrieve the eggs from your ovaries and place them with sperm in the INVOCELL device.



The eggs and sperm are placed in the INVOCELL culture device.



Your doctor will then place the culture device inside the retention device, and position them inside your vagina.

YOU SHOULD KNOW: There shouldn't be any discomfort while the device is in your body. If there is, call your doctor right away.

AND REMEMBER: During this time, avoid any strenuous physical activity or any activity that could change the temperature of your vagina. So—no sexual intercourse, no taking a bath, no saunas, and no douching. Ask your doctor if you have any questions about what you can and can't do while INVOCELL is in your body and read the Patient Information.



After this incubation period, your doctor will remove the device from your body and examine the embryos that have developed.



Then, your doctor will work with you to decide on the number of embryos to be transferred to your uterus. And the good news is, you can freeze any remaining embryos.
